

The University of Calgary History Award was started by the Calgary Branch of the UELAC in 1967 to commemorate the establishment of the University of Calgary as an autonomous institution and as a Centennial project. It awarded \$50.00 per year to a student who excelled in Canadian History. It was increased to \$200.00 in 2009 and again this year to \$500.00 by using some of the money willed to the Calgary Branch by Evelyn de Mille (pictured above).
