

Canadian Military Photos Lost and Found - Research Group

• This past Thursday the grave marker to my 4x great grandparents, Peter Smith Campbell and his wife Catherine Pickard, was finally installed at Greenwood Cemetery in Owen Sound. After years of our family pursuing this endeavour and navigating the red

tape of such a project, we finally succeeded in making this a reality. Peter Smith Campbell was born in 1791, the son of a United Empire Loyalist named Robert Campbell who had served with Butler's Rangers throughout their bloody campaigns of the Revolutionary War.

- Peter would follow in his father's footsteps serving during the War of 1812 with Flank Company of the 1st Lincoln Militia through many major engagements including that at Queenston Heights where General Isaac Brock was mortally wounded stopping an American invasion across the Niagara River.
- He farmed there for a number of years forming what came to be known as "Campbell's Cross", an intersection which still exists today. Well into his 50s he then made his way to Owen Sound with some of his sons where he was one of the first settlers in that area. Records show he had a Tavern's license so likely operated one of the earliest such establishments in the area as well. This ultimate 160 mile trek from St Catharines to Owen Sound was made by horse and wagon through dangerous territory to land that still remained unsettled.



#### **Great Lakes Lighthouse Keepers Association**

This morning's History Lesson: Long before planes, trains, automobiles, or even rudimentary roads for that matter, water transportation was the only feasible way to move people and goods around the Great Lakes region in the most efficient manner. With 10,322 miles of shoreline, the Great Lakes presented ship captains with numerous hazards to navigation an encounter with any one of which could spell disaster for a voyage. Hence the need for the hundreds of lighthouses that were eventually established to serve as aids to navigation. Bordered by eight U.S. states and Canadian province of Ontario to the north, the Great Lakes remain home to over 350 active lighthouses which is the highest concentration of these historical landmarks in North America. Commercial maritime shipping remains important to the economy and growth of the Great Lakes region. However, modern electronic aids to navigation employed aboard ships today have rendered the old lighthouses redundant for the most part.

Still, lighthouses remain as magnets to travelers drawn to their often scenic locations and interested in the maritime heritage of the Great Lakes.
