Evolution of the Chilliwack Branch newsletter "Link Up".



Originally titled UELAC Chilliwack Branch. These early "newsletters" took the form of handouts at various branch meetings. The newsletter was formalized and numbered about November 1994, with the name changed to "Loyalist Link Up" and the chain motif appeared. By the end of 1995, only "Link Up" was being used.

In the Fall of 2003, the chain motif is dropped but "Link Up" remained.
In 2012, a whole new format is developed still titled "Link Up" on the masthead.
The issues from June 2012 forward are featured in the "Newsletter" tab on our website.
Early on, each branch of the UELAC was asked to send a report of activities to the Editor, for each of the two yearly issues of the Loyalist Gazette.

Please enjoy your walk down memory lane.


This photocopy of the letter dated September 20, 1990 asking to be chartered as a branch of the United Empire Loyalists of Canada, is all we can find in our Archives.

It was signed by ten people well known to our branch and all had their UEL certificates.

This copy was found in the November, 1995 issue of the "Link Up" in celebration of the 5th Anniversary of the Branch. Where might the original be?

The Charter was granted on October 19,1990, at a ceremony at the Chilliwack Museum (formerly City Hall) and was presented to Andrew Webb UE. Our newsletter records that there were "over 70 in attendance at the Museum for a Charter Night Pot Luck supper. Dominion President Arnold Nethercott UE and his wife Barbara came from Ontario to make the presentation".

Digging into the ten boxes of pictures we have in the Archives, we came across one picture from the inaugural presentation of the Charter in October of 1990.

The picture does not have names on the back, but we can identify the following:

Far left to right - Lois Dickinson UE; Arnold W. Nethercott UE Dominion President reading the proclamation; hidden behind the charter paper and behind the flag is Scott Roos UE in the uniform of a Butler's Ranger. Sorry the other people remain nameless for now.

We did not want to just guess. Can anyone help so we can update this file?



The newspaper article on the following page notes that there were about 70 in attendance. From the "Branching Out" history on our website is this excerpt:

The charter ceremony was brief, but impressive. The Union Jack was carried by seventeen year old Scott Roos, UE, in a Butler's Rangers Officer's uniform. Scott was followed by his mother Maribel Roos UE, in Loyalist costume, who carried the charter. President Nethercott, seated in a City Council chair, circa 1912, signed the charter with flourish and then presented it to Andrew Webb who holds ten certificates. The ten petitioners joined Mr. Webb in loyally accepting the charter. With them was Rosemary Curlyo UE. The other guests then stood in recognition of their commitment. It was a happy, colourful evening with the program preceded by a pot luck supper of true Loyalist hospitality. A Loyalist cake was cut by Betty Keller and Vera Webb. Tables were centred with nosegays of B.C. dogwoods linked with red Ontario maple leaves. The nosegays also contained blue hydrangeas from the memorial garden at Chilliwack Junior Secondary School where 22 bushes commemorate the students who lost their lives on active service with the R.C.AF. in World War II.

The Chilliwack people were very moved, when, at the end of the evening, Mrs. Nethercott collected some hydrangea sprigs to take home. On a more official note, greetings were brought by Alderman Gary Mason, District of Chilliwack, himself inquiring about possible Loyalist ancestry from Nova Scotia. Peggy Still, President of the Chilliwack Museum and Historical Society, extended greetings on behalf of its 550 members. Messages of congratulation were received from John Orr UE, Regional Vice-President. Greetings were also forwarded from Eleanor Sanderson, U.E., President of the Victoria Branch. The Vancouver Branch (established 1932) was represented by John Graham UE, Vice-President; along with Vona Smith UE, past genealogist; Joan Fishleigh, present genealogist; and Dolly Hannay, branch treasurer, and new president of the B.C. Loyalists start branch

Descendants of United Empire Loyalists met Thursday night at the Chilliwack Museum to officially charter a branch of the United Empire Loyalists' Association of Canada.

Dominion president Arnold W. Nethercott, of London, Ontario came from headquarters in Toronto to officiate at the chartering ceremony.

The Chilliwack Branch is the first new branch in B.C. in almost 60 years. It forms part of the Dominion Association organized in 1914 to make Loyalist descendants aware of their history and upon proof of Loyalist ancestry, they may apply for certificates allowing them to affix the letters VE after their names.

Governor Carleton in 1789 to:

adhered to the Unity of the Empire, and joined the Royal Standard before the Treaty of Separation in the year 1783 and all their Children and their Descendants by either sex, are to be distinguished by the following Capitals affixed to their names U.E."

Approximately 70 people attended the potluck supper and program.

Scott Roos, in the uniform of a Butler's Rangers' officer, carried the flag and Maribel Roos in Loyalist costume brought the charter contained in the historic document box of John McCutcheon, first reeve of Chilliwack Municipality in 1873.

President Nethercott signed the charter and presented it to Andrew Webb, holder of 10 VE certificates.

John Graham, vice-president of This honor was granted by the Vancouver branch, made the presentation of reference books on "Those Loyalists who have Vancouver's behalf. Joan Fishleigh, Vancouver genealogist gave books forwarded from the Victoria branch.

The highlights of the conference include guest speakers **Dr. Leah Grandy** and *Loyalist Trails* contributor **Stephen Davidson**. There will be tours of Trinity Anglican Loyalist church, the Old Loyalist cemetery, The Black Loyalist History Centre, and the Loyalist House. The Gala Dinner will feature speaker and newly appointed honorary fellow **Dr. Bonnie Hoskins**.

We will cap off the Conference with a Drumhead church service at Trinity Church with DeLancey's Brigade.

There will be free time to tour downtown Saint John to take in the stores, restaurants, markets, the container village of artisans on the newly renovated harbour-front.

Special Resolution to amend Quorum number:

To be presented at the March 8, 2025 AGM:

Preamble: Our quorum was established in 2018 and is written into our By-laws as ten (10) members. There is a provision that indicates: that if the quorum was not met, that those in attendance could wait 15 minutes for more attendees, and then declare those in attendance be the quorum. This proviso has had to be enacted twice in recent years. Notes from the meeting that proposed both the quorum number and the proviso, indicated we were looking at using 10% of the voting membership as the number. Membership at that time was 100 and so ten was established.

As with many branches of the UELAC, membership has declined. For us, over the past eight years due to members moving away, being to ill to participate or passing away we are seeing the same decline.

A high of over 100 was accomplished in 2014. Now in the year just finished (2024), the number has declined to just 53. But we soldier on.

The quorum is used at the Annual General Meeting to approve the year end statement, to adopt the minutes of the previous AGM, to pass any special resolutions and to elect the officers for the coming year. Therefore, it is proposed that the quorum number be established as 10% (ten percent) of the membership number as of December 31st, of the previous year. For example, this could mean:

If membership as at December 31st of the year was 62, then the quorum number at the AGM the following month of February or March would then be 6. If it is 53 as per this year, it would be 5. The passing of this resolution would take effect the spring AGM of 2026 for business as of year end 2025.

Resolution: Moved by Judy Scholz UE seconded by Carole Lefler UE:

Be it resolved that the quorum needed to conduct business for Chilliwack Branch UELAC at any

Annual General meeting be established at 10% of the total membership as of December 31st of the

previous year to coincide with the dates on the Financial Statement presented.




